Dear Parents,

Thus says the LORD: "Stand by the roads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls. But they said, 'We will not walk in it.' Jeremiah 6:16 ESV

When we read this verse in God's Word we see that there are many roads we can traverse. Obviously all of them will lead somewhere, however, while several may lead to the desired destination many will lead elsewhere. Not every destination is desirable; these we want to avoid. Further, while several other roads may actually get us to where we want to be, some are easy direct routes and some may be treacherous, long and hard going.

So the question is then, how do we know which road to take? The answer is that we need to:

- look (be actively engaged and discerning)
- ask (ask those who are more experienced and glean from them)
- find the "ancient path" or the true and tried way
- walk on that path

This is not only true spiritually, but also academically. As a Christian School we want students to become their best, to know how to read and write, understand mathematics, science and art, so that they can become productive and contributing citizens.

However, while that is the desired destination, we are concerned that the road they take to get there is not cluttered with the debris of confusion: SOGI, Political Agendas, hedonism, and uncertainty of identity. Your school's staff are the "experienced travelers" pointing your child(ren) toward the "ancient path" that will lead them to the desired destination where the way is good and they find rest for their souls as they travel.

Teachers and Support Staff at NCCS work hard to make learning engaging and plan lessons from a Biblical framework. Their observations and Reporting comments are insights into how successfully your child is walking on that "ancient road" toward each destination.

In light of this, I implore all parents to set aside some time this coming Friday and contact the office to set up a time and participate in Parent-Teacher Interviews (G2, 5/6, 7, & 8/9) or Student Led Conferences (K-1 & 3/4). This is your opportunity to discover how your child is traveling on their "educational road."

We open the doors at 6:30 pm and begin with some time for fellowship and prayer (for your school, the staff, our finances, our building, etc.) and then moving into the business portion.

These AGMs let you know what has happened, what is happening, and where NCCS is heading in the future. All of this impacts your child making your attendance of paramount importance.
